Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$6,000,000 ongoing from the Income Tax Fund Utah State University for the Utah Forest Restoration Institute for staff and restoration projects. The bill also reduces \$2,200,000 ongoing from the Income Tax Fund within the University's budget as an offset for a net Income Tax Fund impact of \$3,800,000.
