AN ACT

To require the Department of State to consult with Congress
on antisemitism in Europe.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Europe
3 from Antisemitic Crime and Extremism Act” or the
4 “PEACE Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. CONSULTATIONS ON ANTISEMITISM IN EUROPE.**

6 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
7 gress that—

8 (1) the Assistant Secretary for European and
9 Eurasian Affairs, in consultation with other relevant
10 officials of the Department of State, should assess
11 the persistent and growing threat of antisemitism
12 and acts of international terrorism in Europe as a
13 matter of importance to the foreign policy of the
14 United States; and

15 (2) the Under Secretary for Political Affairs,
16 acting through the Assistant Secretary for European
17 and Eurasian Affairs, should diplomatically engage
18 governments of countries of apparent concern on ef-
19 forts for transatlantic cooperation to counter and
20 address antisemitism and acts of international ter-
21 rorism that may threaten transatlantic stability, the
22 safety and security of United States citizens, and in-
23 stitutions abroad.

24 (b) CONSULTATION.—Not later than 180 days after
25 the date of the enactment of this Act, and annually there-
26 after for two years, the Assistant Secretary for European

1 and Eurasian Affairs shall consult with the appropriate
2 congressional committees on the matters described in sub-
3 section (a).

4 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
5 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-
6 sional committees” means—

7 (1) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
8 House of Representatives; and

9 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
10 Senate.
