Mr. WILSON of South Carolina introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Workforce

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## A BILL

To amend the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 to provide that individuals who have been convicted of sex offenses against minors may not serve in certain positions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ending Predator Ac-  
5 cess to Union Power Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON HOLDING OFFICE.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 504(a) of the Labor-Man-  
8 agement Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959 (29 U.S.C.

1 504(a)) is amended by inserting after “grievous bodily in-  
2 jury,” the following: “a sex offense against a minor,”.

3 (b) TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.—Section 504(a) of the  
4 Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959  
5 (29 U.S.C. 504(a)) is further amended by striking “Act  
6 any” and inserting “Act, any”.

7 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
8 this Act shall take effect 30 days after the date of enact-  
9 ment of this Act.

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
