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## A BILL

To give priority consideration to units of local government that provide gang affiliation information in reports to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of Byrne-JAG grants, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Stop Gang Violence  
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORTING ON GANG AFFILIATION.**

7 Section 505(f) of title I of the Omnibus Crime Con-  
8 trol and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. 10156(f))

1 is amended by inserting “and jurisdictions that include,  
2 as part of such reporting to the Federal Bureau of Inves-  
3 tigation (including the National Gang Intelligence Center),  
4 information on offenses that are suspected to be gang-re-  
5 lated” before the period.

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
