## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide post-employment limits for attorneys of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Department of Justice  
5 Integrity Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. POST-EMPLOYMENT RULES FOR ATTORNEYS OF**  
7 **THE UNITED STATES.**

8 Section 207 of title 18, United States Code, is  
9 amended by adding at the end the following:

1       “(m) POST-EMPLOYMENT LIMITS FOR ATTORNEYS  
2 OF THE UNITED STATES.—

3           “(1) RESTRICTION.—Any person who is a  
4 former attorney for the United States, who, while  
5 serving in that position, personally and substantially  
6 participated in any Federal prosecution of a business  
7 entity, or in any agreement with a business entity  
8 pursuant to section 3161(h)(2), and who, within 1  
9 year after the termination of that person’s service in  
10 that position, knowingly represents, aids, or assists  
11 a business entity in any Federal prosecution of such  
12 business entity, or any agreement with such business  
13 entity pursuant to section 3161(h)(2), shall be pun-  
14 ished as provided in section 216 of this title.

15           “(2) DEFINITION.—In this subsection, the term  
16 ‘business entity’ means a corporation, association,  
17 partnership, limited liability company, limited liabil-  
18 ity partnership, or other legal commercial entity.”.
