Mr. BURLISON (for himself, Mr. OGLES, and Mr. MOORE of Alabama) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to strike all exceptions to the circumstances in which it is unlawful for aliens to vote, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Exceptions for
5 Non-Citizens Voting Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. VOTING BY ALIENS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 611 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “, unless—”
2 and all that follows through “one or more of such
3 Federal offices”; and

4 (2) by striking subsection (c).

5 (b) INADMISSIBILITY FOR UNLAWFUL VOTERS.—
6 Section 212(a)(10)(D) of the Immigration and Nationality
7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(10)(D)) is amended to read as fol-
8 lows:

9 “(D) UNLAWFUL VOTERS.—Any alien who
10 has voted in violation of any Federal, State, or
11 local constitutional provision, statute, ordi-
12 nance, or regulation is inadmissible.”.

13 (c) DEPORTABILITY FOR UNLAWFUL VOTERS.—Sec-
14 tion 237(a)(6) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8
15 U.S.C. 1227(a)(6)) is amended to read as follows:

16 “(6) UNLAWFUL VOTERS.—Any alien who has
17 voted in violation of any Federal, State, or local con-
18 stitutional provision, statute, ordinance, or regula-
19 tion is deportable.”.

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
