Condemning the hateful comments of Texas congressional candidate Maureen Galindo.

Mr. GREEN of Texas submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

RESOLUTION

Condemning the hateful comments of Texas congressional candidate Maureen Galindo.

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This resolution may be cited as the “Original Resolu-
3 tion Condemning the Hateful Comments of Texas Con-
4 gressional Candidate Maureen Galindo”.

5 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

6 The House of Representatives finds the following:

7 Whereas, on May 13, 2026, referring to herself,
8 Texas congressional candidate Maureen Galindo posted on
9 Instagram, “When Maureen gets into Congress, she’ll
10 write legislation so that all Zionism is undoubtedly Anti-

1 semitic, since it's Zionists harming the Semites. She'll
2 turn Karnes ICE Detention Center into a prison for
3 American Zionists and former ICE officers for human
4 trafficking. (It will also be a castration processing center
5 for pedophiles which will probably be most of the Zion-
6 ists)'';

7 Whereas Ms. Galindo's comments advocate the im-
8 prisonment of Americans based on their ideologies and as-
9 sociations and endorse the use of detention facilities as
10 institutions for political punishment;

11 Whereas, throughout history, some governments have
12 used detention camps and prisons to persecute individuals
13 because of their race, religion, ethnicity, political beliefs,
14 or perceived affiliations;

15 Whereas, during World War II, Nazi Germany estab-
16 lished concentration camps that imprisoned and murdered
17 millions of people, including six million Jews, who suffered
18 the horrors of the Holocaust;

19 Whereas among the lessons of the Holocaust is the
20 demonstration of the dangerous consequences of targeting
21 individuals or groups for detention based on identity, be-
22 liefs, or associations;

23 Whereas calls for the imprisonment of persons pos-
24 sibly associated with Jewish identity evoke some of the
25 darkest chapters in human history and are deeply offen-

1 sive to Holocaust survivors, their descendants, and the
2 families of those who suffered religious persecution;

3 Whereas the First Amendment to the Constitution
4 protects freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and free-
5 dom of association for all people in the United States; it
6 does not, however, protect persons from the condemnation
7 of their hate speech; and

8 Whereas calls to imprison and castrate Americans be-
9 cause of their ideologies or affiliations are contrary to the
10 idealized principles of liberty and justice enshrined in the
11 Constitution: Now, therefore, be it

12 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

13 (1) condemns the hateful comments of Texas
14 congressional candidate Maureen Galindo, advo-
15 cating the imprisonment and castration of Ameri-
16 cans based on their ideologies or associations.
