Mr. JACK, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1181) to prohibit payment card networks and covered entities from requiring the use of or assigning merchant category codes that distinguish a firearms retailer from general-merchandise retailer or sporting-goods retailer, and for

other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 9022) making appropriations for energy and water development and related agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 8595) making appropriations for national security, Department of State, and related programs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 9237) to amend titles 10 and 38, United States Code, and other Federal laws, to improve benefits for veterans and the administration of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 1181) to prohibit payment card networks and covered en-
4 tities from requiring the use of or assigning merchant cat-
5 egory codes that distinguish a firearms retailer from gen-
6 eral-merchandise retailer or sporting-goods retailer, and
7 for other purposes. All points of order against consider-
8 ation of the bill are waived. The amendment in the nature
9 of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Finan-
10 cial Services now printed in the bill shall be considered
11 as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as
12 read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, as
13 amended, are waived. The previous question shall be con-
14 sidered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any
15 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-
16 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-

1 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
2 member of the Committee on Financial Services or their
3 respective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

4 SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution
5 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,
6 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the
7 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration
8 of the bill (H.R. 9022) making appropriations for energy
9 and water development and related agencies for the fiscal
10 year ending September 30, 2027, and for other purposes.
11 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All
12 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
13 General debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not
14 exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair
15 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appro-
16 priations or their respective designees. After general de-
17 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the
18 five-minute rule. The bill shall be considered as read.
19 Points of order against provisions in the bill for failure
20 to comply with clause 2 of rule XXI are waived.

21 SEC. 3. (a) No amendment to H.R. 9022 shall be in
22 order except those printed in part A of the report of the
23 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution, amend-
24 ments en bloc described in section 4 of this resolution, and

1 pro forma amendments described in section 5 of this reso-
2 lution.

3 (b) Each amendment printed in part A of the report
4 of the Committee on Rules shall be considered only in the
5 order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Mem-
6 ber designated in the report, shall be considered as read,
7 shall be debatable for the time specified in the report
8 equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an
9 opponent, shall not be subject to amendment except as
10 provided by section 5 of this resolution, and shall not be
11 subject to a demand for division of the question in the
12 House or in the Committee of the Whole.

13 (c) All points of order against amendments printed
14 in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules or
15 against amendments en bloc described in section 4 of this
16 resolution are waived.

17 SEC. 4. It shall be in order at any time for the chair
18 of the Committee on Appropriations or his designee to
19 offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments print-
20 ed in part A of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
21 companying this resolution not earlier disposed of. Amend-
22 ments en bloc offered pursuant to this section shall be con-
23 sidered as read, shall be debatable for 20 minutes equally
24 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
25 member of the Committee on Appropriations or their re-

1 spective designees, shall not be subject to amendment ex-
2 cept as provided by section 5 of this resolution, and shall
3 not be subject to a demand for division of the question
4 in the House or in the Committee of the Whole.

5 SEC. 5. During consideration of H.R. 9022 for
6 amendment, the chair and ranking minority member of
7 the Committee on Appropriations or their respective des-
8 ignees may offer up to 10 pro forma amendments each
9 at any point for the purpose of debate.

10 SEC. 6. At the conclusion of consideration of H.R.
11 9022 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report
12 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have
13 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered
14 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
15 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
16 recommit.

17 SEC. 7. At any time after adoption of this resolution
18 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,
19 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the
20 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration
21 of the bill (H.R. 8595) making appropriations for national
22 security, Department of State, and related programs for
23 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2027, and for other
24 purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
25 with. All points of order against consideration of the bill

1 are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
2 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
3 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
4 Committee on Appropriations or their respective des-
5 ignees. After general debate the bill shall be considered
6 for amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill shall
7 be considered as read. Points of order against provisions
8 in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 or clause
9 5(a) of rule XXI are waived.

10 SEC. 8. (a) No amendment to H.R. 8595 shall be in
11 order except those printed in part B of the report of the
12 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution, amend-
13 ments en bloc described in section 9 of this resolution, and
14 pro forma amendments described in section 10 of this res-
15 olution.

16 (b) Each amendment printed in part B of the report
17 of the Committee on Rules shall be considered only in the
18 order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Mem-
19 ber designated in the report, shall be considered as read,
20 shall be debatable for the time specified in the report
21 equally divided and controlled by the proponent and an
22 opponent, shall not be subject to amendment except as
23 provided by section 10 of this resolution, and shall not
24 be subject to a demand for division of the question in the
25 House or in the Committee of the Whole.

1 (c) All points of order against amendments printed
2 in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules or
3 against amendments en bloc described in section 9 of this
4 resolution are waived.

5 SEC. 9. It shall be in order at any time for the chair
6 of the Committee on Appropriations or his designee to
7 offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments print-
8 ed in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-
9 companying this resolution not earlier disposed of. Amend-
10 ments en bloc offered pursuant to this section shall be con-
11 sidered as read, shall be debatable for 20 minutes equally
12 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
13 member of the Committee on Appropriations or their re-
14 spective designees, shall not be subject to amendment ex-
15 cept as provided by section 10 of this resolution, and shall
16 not be subject to a demand for division of the question
17 in the House or in the Committee of the Whole.

18 SEC. 10. During consideration of H.R. 8595 for
19 amendment, the chair and ranking minority member of
20 the Committee on Appropriations or their respective des-
21 ignees may offer up to 10 pro forma amendments each
22 at any point for the purpose of debate.

23 SEC. 11. At the conclusion of consideration of H.R.
24 8595 for amendment the Committee shall rise and report
25 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have

1 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered
2 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
3 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
4 recommit.

5 SEC. 12. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 9237)
7 to amend titles 10 and 38, United States Code, and other
8 Federal laws, to improve benefits for veterans and the ad-
9 ministration of the Department of Veterans Affairs. All
10 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
11 The amendment printed in part C of the report of the
12 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution shall be
13 considered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be con-
14 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in
15 the bill, as amended, are waived. The previous question
16 shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as amended,
17 and on any further amendment thereto, to final passage
18 without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate
19 equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking
20 minority member of the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
21 or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to recom-
22 mit.
