Gold Medal Schools Pilot Program

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill creates the Gold Medal Schools Pilot Program.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ defines terms;
- ▶ creates a five-year pilot program known as the Gold Medal Schools Pilot Program to:
 - promote physical activity in an eligible school; and
 - promote healthy eating habits in an eligible school;
- ▶ requires the State Board of Education to:
 - administer the program;
 - select an eligible school for participation in the program; and
 - award program funds;
- ▶ creates a reporting requirement;
- ▶ creates a cap for administrative costs associated with the program;
- ▶ creates a sunset date for the program; and
- ▶ makes technical and conforming changes.

Other Special Clauses:

This bill provides a special effective date.
