LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill enacts a provision relating to charter school enrollment preferences.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

▸ expands charter school enrollment preference to certain students within the boundaries of a political subdivision; and

▸ makes technical and conforming changes.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

Section 1. Section **53G-6-502** is amended to read:

**53G-6-502 . Eligible students.**

(1) As used in this section:

(a) "At capacity" means operating above the school's open enrollment threshold.

↪ ~~(b) "COVID-19 emergency" means the spread of COVID-19 that the World Health Organization declared a pandemic on March 11, 2020.~~

↪ ~~(b)~~ ~~↪~~ "Open enrollment threshold" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53G-6-401.

↪ ~~(d)~~ ~~(c)~~ ~~↪~~ "Refugee" means a person who is eligible to receive benefits and services from the

29 federal Office of Refugee Resettlement.

30 ~~Ĥ~~→ [(e)] (d) ←Ĥ "School of residence" means the same as that term is defined in  
30a Section 53G-6-401.

31 (2) All resident students of the state qualify for admission to a charter school, subject to the  
32 limitations set forth in this section and Section 53G-6-503.

33 (3)(a) A charter school shall enroll:

34 (i) a foster child residing in the same residence as an individual who is enrolled in the  
35 charter school; and

36 (ii) an eligible student other than a child described in Subsection (3)(a)(i) who  
37 submits a timely application, unless the number of applications exceeds the  
38 capacity of a program, class, grade level, or the charter school.

39 (b) If the number of applications described in Subsection (3)(a)(ii) exceeds the capacity  
40 of a program, class, grade level, or the charter school, the charter school shall select  
41 students on a random basis, except as provided in Subsections (4) through (8).

42 (4) A charter school may give an enrollment preference to:

43 (a) a child or grandchild of an individual who has actively participated in the  
44 development of the charter school;

45 (b) a child or grandchild of a member of the charter school governing board;

46 (c) a sibling of an individual who was previously or is presently enrolled in the charter  
47 school;

48 (d) a child of an employee of the charter school;

49 (e) a student articulating between charter schools offering similar programs that are  
50 governed by the same charter school governing board;

51 (f) a student articulating from one charter school to another pursuant to an articulation  
52 agreement between the charter schools that is approved by the State Charter School  
53 Board;

54 (g) an individual seeking enrollment in a charter school if:

55 (i) the individual's sibling is a student enrolled in a charter school; and

56 (ii) the charter school where the individual is seeking enrollment has an articulation  
57 agreement with the charter school where the sibling is enrolled that the State  
58 Charter School Board approves;

59 (h) a student who resides within up to a two-mile radius of the charter school and whose  
60 school of residence is at capacity;

61 (i) a student who resides within the boundaries of a political subdivision containing the

62 charter school and whose school of residence is at capacity;

68 (5)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (5)(b), and notwithstanding Subsection (4)(h), a  
69 charter school that is approved by the state board after May 13, 2014, and is located  
70 in a high growth area as defined in Section 53G-6-504 shall give an enrollment  
71 preference to a student who resides within a two-mile radius of the charter school.

72 (b) The requirement to give an enrollment preference under Subsection (5)(a) does not  
73 apply to a charter school that was approved without a high priority status pursuant to  
74 Subsection 53G-6-504(7)(b).

75 (6) If a district school converts to charter status, the charter school shall give an enrollment  
76 preference to students who would have otherwise attended it as a district school.

77 (7)(a) A charter school whose mission is to enhance learning opportunities for refugees  
78 or children of refugee families may give an enrollment preference to refugees or  
79 children of refugee families.

80 (b) A charter school whose mission is to enhance learning opportunities for English  
81 language learners may give an enrollment preference to English language learners.

82 (8) A charter school may weight the charter school's lottery to give a slightly better chance  
83 of admission to educationally disadvantaged students, including:

84 (a) low-income students;

85 (b) students with disabilities;

86 (c) English language learners;

87 (d) migrant students;

88 (e) neglected or delinquent students; and

89 (f) homeless students.

90 (9) A charter school may not discriminate in the charter school's admission policies or  
91 practices on the same basis as other public schools may not discriminate in admission  
92 policies and practices.

93 Section 2. **Effective Date.**

94 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2026.
