2 **LONG TITLE**

3 **General Description:**

4 This bill modifies provisions regarding autism insurance coverage.

5 **Highlighted Provisions:**

6 This bill:

- 7 ▶ amends definitions;
- 8 ▶ requires health benefit plans to allow additional health care providers to receive insurance
- 9 reimbursement for diagnosing autism;
- 10 ▶ eliminates outdated language regarding preexisting insurance mandates; and
- 11 ▶ makes other technical and conforming changes.

20 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

21 Section 1. Section **26B-3-904** is amended to read:

22 **26B-3-904 . Program benefits.**

- 23 (1) Except as provided in Subsection (3), medical and dental program benefits shall be
- 24 benchmarked, in accordance with 42 U.S.C. Sec. 1397cc, as follows:
- 25 (a) medical program benefits, including behavioral health care benefits, shall be
- 26 benchmarked effective July 1, 2019, and on July 1 every third year thereafter, to:
- 27 (i) be substantially equal to a health benefit plan with the largest insured commercial
- 28 enrollment offered by a health maintenance organization in the state; and
- 29

- 31 (ii) comply with the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act, Pub. L. No.
 32 110-343; and
- 33 (b) dental program benefits shall be benchmarked effective July 1, 2019, and on July 1
 34 every third year thereafter in accordance with the Children's Health Insurance
 35 Program Reauthorization Act of 2009, to be substantially equal to a dental benefit
 36 plan that has the largest insured, commercial, non-Medicaid enrollment of covered
 37 lives that is offered in the state, except that the utilization review mechanism for
 38 orthodontia shall be based on medical necessity.
- 39 (2) On or before July 1 of each year, the department shall publish the benchmark for dental
 40 program benefits established under Subsection (1)(b).
- 41 (3) The program benefits:
- 42 (a) for enrollees who are at or below 100% of the federal poverty level are exempt from
 43 the benchmark requirements of Subsections (1) and (2); and
- 44 (b) shall include [~~treatment for autism spectrum disorder~~] autism spectrum disorder
 45 treatment as defined in Section 31A-22-642, which:
- 46 (i) shall include coverage for applied behavioral analysis; and
- 47 (ii) if the benchmark described in Subsection (1)(a) does not include the coverage
 48 described in this Subsection (3)(b), the department shall exclude from the
 49 benchmark described in Subsection (1)(a) for any purpose other than providing
 50 benefits under the program.

51 Section 2. Section **31A-22-642** is amended to read:

52 **31A-22-642 . Insurance coverage for autism spectrum disorder.**

- 53 (1) As used in this section:
- 54 (a) "Applied behavior analysis" means the design, implementation, and evaluation of
 55 environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to produce
 56 socially significant improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct
 57 observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationship between
 58 environment and behavior.
- 59 (b) "Autism spectrum disorder" means pervasive developmental disorders as defined by
 60 the most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders
 61 (DSM).
- 62 (c) "Autism spectrum disorder diagnosis" means medically necessary assessments,
 63 evaluations, or tests that are:
- 64 (i) generally accepted within the medical and mental health professions to be

65 appropriate and necessary to diagnose whether an individual has an autism
 66 spectrum disorder; and

67 (ii) performed by a qualified health care provider.

68 (d)(i) "Autism spectrum disorder treatment" means evidence-based care and related
 69 equipment prescribed or ordered for an individual diagnosed with an autism
 70 spectrum disorder by a qualified health care provider who determines the care to
 71 be medically necessary.

72 (ii) "Autism spectrum disorder treatment" includes:

73 (A) behavioral health treatment;

74 (B) pharmacy care;

75 (C) psychiatric care;

76 (D) psychological care; and

77 (E) therapeutic care.

78 [(e)] (e) "Behavioral health treatment" means counseling and treatment programs,
 79 including applied behavior analysis, that are:

80 (i) necessary to develop, maintain, or restore, to the maximum extent practicable, the
 81 functioning of an individual; and

82 (ii) provided or supervised by a:

83 (A) board certified behavior analyst; or

84 (B) person licensed under Title 58, Chapter 1, Division of Professional Licensing
 85 Act, whose scope of practice includes mental health services.

86 [(d) "Diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder" means medically necessary assessments,
 87 evaluations, or tests:]

88 [(i) performed by a licensed physician who is board certified in neurology,
 89 psychiatry, or pediatrics and has experience diagnosing autism spectrum disorder,
 90 or a licensed psychologist with experience diagnosing autism spectrum disorder;
 91 and]

92 [(ii) necessary to diagnose whether an individual has an autism spectrum disorder.]

93 [(e)] (f) "Pharmacy care" means medications prescribed by a licensed physician and any
 94 health-related services considered medically necessary to determine the need or
 95 effectiveness of the medications.

96 [(f)] (g) "Psychiatric care" means direct or consultative services provided by a
 97 psychiatrist licensed in the state in which the psychiatrist practices.

98 [(g)] (h) "Psychological care" means direct or consultative services provided by a

99 psychologist licensed in the state in which the psychologist practices.

100 (i) "Qualified health care provider" means an individual who:

101 (i) has completed training recognized by medical and mental health professions as
 102 being appropriate and necessary to diagnose whether an individual has an autism
 103 spectrum disorder; and

104 (ii) is licensed as any of the following:

105 (A) a physician licensed under Title 58, Chapter 67, Utah Medical Practice Act, or
 106 Title 58, Chapter 68, Utah Osteopathic Medical Practice Act;

107 (B) an advanced practice registered nurse licensed under Title 58, Chapter 31b,
 108 Nurse Practice Act;

109 (C) a clinical social worker licensed under Title 58, Chapter 60, Part 2, Social
 110 Worker Licensing Act;

111 (D) a marriage and family therapist licensed under Title 58, Chapter 60, Part 3,
 112 Marriage and Family Therapist Licensing Act;

113 (E) a clinical mental health counselor licensed under Title 58, Chapter 60, Part 4,
 114 Clinical Mental Health Counselor Licensing Act;

115 (F) a psychologist licensed under Title 58, Chapter 61, Psychologist Licensing
 116 Act; or

117 (G) a physician assistant licensed under Title 58, Chapter 70a, Utah Physician
 118 Assistant Act.

119 ~~(h)~~ (j) "Therapeutic care" means services provided by licensed or certified speech
 120 therapists, occupational therapists, or physical therapists.

121 ~~(i) "Treatment for autism spectrum disorder":~~

122 ~~(i) means evidence-based care and related equipment prescribed or ordered for an~~
 123 ~~individual diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder by a physician or a~~
 124 ~~licensed psychologist described in Subsection (1)(d) who determines the care to~~
 125 ~~be medically necessary; and]~~

- 133 (2)(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 31A-22-618.5, a health benefit plan
 134 offered in the individual market or the large group market and entered into or
 135 renewed on or after ~~[January 1, 2016, and before]~~January 1, 2020, shall provide
 136 coverage for ~~[the] autism spectrum disorder diagnosis and autism spectrum disorder~~
 137 ~~treatment[~~of autism spectrum disorder~~]~~:
- 138 (i) for a child who is at least two years old, but younger than 10 years old; and
 - 139 (ii) in accordance with the requirements of this section and rules made by the
 140 commissioner.
- 141 ~~[(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 31A-22-618.5, a health benefit plan~~
 142 ~~offered in the individual market or the large group market and entered into or~~
 143 ~~renewed on or after January 1, 2020, shall provide coverage for the diagnosis and~~
 144 ~~treatment of autism spectrum disorder in accordance with the requirements of this~~
 145 ~~section and rules made by the commissioner.]~~
- 146 (3) The commissioner may adopt rules in accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah
 147 Administrative Rulemaking Act, to set the minimum standards of coverage for ~~[the]~~
 148 ~~autism spectrum disorder treatment[~~of autism spectrum disorder~~]~~.
- 149 (4) Subject to Subsection (5), the rules described in Subsection (3) shall establish durational
 150 limits, amount limits, deductibles, copayments, and coinsurance for ~~[the] autism~~
 151 ~~spectrum disorder treatment [of autism spectrum disorder]~~that are similar to, or
 152 identical to, the coverage provided for other illnesses or diseases.
- 153 (5)(a) Coverage for behavioral health treatment for a person with an autism spectrum
 154 disorder shall cover at least 600 hours a year.
- 155 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (5)(a), for a health benefit plan offered in the individual
 156 market or the large group market and entered into or renewed on or after January 1,
 157 2020, coverage for behavioral health treatment for a person with an autism spectrum
 158 disorder may not have a limit on the number of hours covered.
 - 159 (c) Other terms and conditions in the health benefit plan that apply to other benefits
 160 covered by the health benefit plan apply to coverage required by this section.
 - 161 (d) Notwithstanding Section 31A-45-303, a health benefit plan providing treatment
 162 under Subsections (5)(a) and (b) shall include in the plan's provider network both
 163 board certified behavior analysts and mental health providers qualified under
 164 Subsection ~~[(1)(e)(ii)]~~ (1)(e)(ii).
 - 165 (e) Except as provided in this section, a health benefit plan may implement cost
 166 containment strategies, including prior authorization requirements, for autism

167 spectrum disorder treatment.

168 (6)(a) A health care provider shall submit a treatment plan for autism spectrum disorder
169 to the insurer within 14 business days of starting treatment for an individual.

170 (b) If an individual is receiving autism spectrum disorder treatment~~[for an autism~~
171 ~~spectrum disorder]~~, an insurer ~~[shall have the right to]~~ may request a review of that
172 treatment not more than once every three months.

173 (c) A review of treatment under this Subsection (6) may include a review of treatment
174 goals and progress toward the treatment goals.

175 (d) If an insurer makes a determination to stop treatment as a result of the review of the
176 treatment plan under this ~~[subsection]~~ Subsection (6), the determination of the insurer
177 may be reviewed under Section 31A-22-629.

178 **Section 3. Effective Date.**
